Dear Members and Friends,

Comedian Bob Hope – whom many of us remember quite fondly as a wonderful entertainer – was married to his wife Delores for 69 years, the longest Hollywood marriage on record. Bob lived two months past his hundredth birthday. Delores died at 102. Delores was a devout Catholic. Bob loved to tell about the time she got on a plane in which two priests were seated in front of her. Three nuns were seated behind her. One of Bob Hope's writers named Charlie Lee was also on the flight. Lee Asked Hope, "Why can't she take out regular flight insurance like the rest of us?" *

No doubt, Jesus Christ has given us the best flight/life insurance any of us could ever have. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16).

Thankfully, Jesus doesn't just offer this to us for the end of our life but for us to have a new way of life. "One of the most obvious examples of Christian servanthood was a young Albanian woman named Agnes. At the age of 18 Agnes gave in to the tugging on her heart that she had felt for many years. She became a nun. . . . In 1948, after 17 years living this cloistered life, Agnes decided to walk away from the convent taking nothing with her except three Saris to go over her white habit. She left the convent and went into the street to serve the least and the lowest . . . She said the goal of her life was to "to be a pencil in God's hand." She said she was called to care for the sick, the poor, the dying, and the dispossessed, to show them the love that God had for them. She spent the rest of her life picking up dying people off the street and carrying them to shelter . . . And she did it with a beautiful smile. We know Agnes, of course, as Mother Theresa, a true saint of God, and one of the great people of the twentieth century. She was the perfect example of the kind of greatness Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. once talked about: "Everybody can be great," he said, "because anybody can serve. You don't have to have a college degree to serve. You don't have to make your subject and verb agree to serve. . . You only need a heart full of grace, a soul generated by love."*

Many years ago, my brother Fred was taking a flight to Rome from JFK Airport and as I sat and watched the flight getting ready to leave the gate, Mother Theresa boarded the plane. In addition to knowing that Fred's flight would be safe in its travel, I was struck by this very special saint's humble bearing.

May it be our special prayer as we go through Holy Week and celebrate the Resurrection "to be pencils in the hand of God".

Asbury UMM Annual Dedication Sunday


On Sunday, March 10th, over fifty Asbury men stood tall for a very special blessing of




